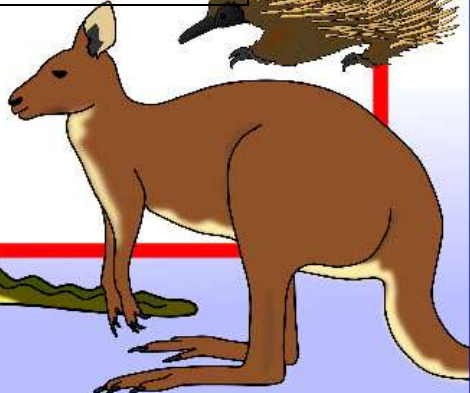
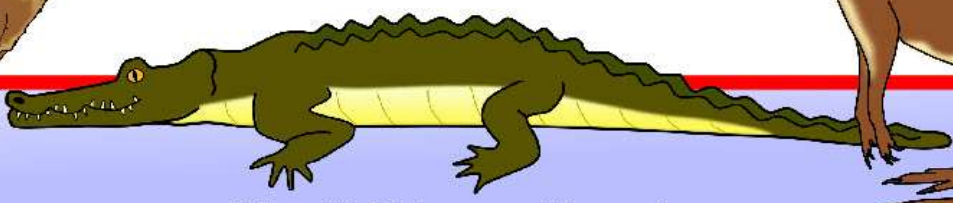
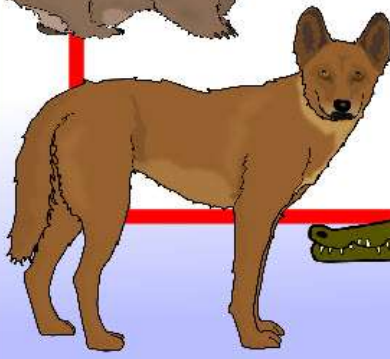
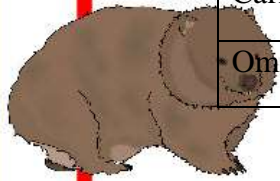
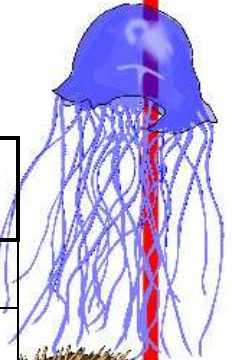
### Task 1:

# Herbivores

These are animals that only like to eat plants.



Examples:

- Cows

# Omnivores

These are animals that like to eat plants and meat.



Examples:

- Humans
- Bears
- Monkeys
- Seagulls

# Carnivores

These are animals that mainly like to eat meat.



Examples:

- Lions
- Cats
- Sharks
- Snakes
- Wolves
